INDUCTION

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILD DURING THEIR TIME IN COLLEGE?

The change from school to college can be more difficult for some students than others. For example, not having to be in at 8.30am every day but getting use to varied start times at locations that may be closer or further away than their previous school. Ask your son or daughter to show you their timetable and help them with their time management so they leave home each morning in time to make their first lesson. If your child is under 19 at the start of their course we will contact you if we have any concerns about their attendance.

SUPPORT FOR LEARNERS WITH ADDITIONAL LEARNING NEEDS

Our team can support learners through their course with specialist support for learning difficulties or physical disabilities including dyslexia, dyspraxia, visual/hearing impairment, mobility issues, ADHD, autism and serious illness.

WELLBEING SUPPORT

Our Wellbeing team, made up of Wellbeing Officers and Counsellors can support you with mental health issues, attendance, advice and guidance and any other pastoral issues which you may have in college.

THE IMPORTANCE OF GCSE MATHS. ENGLISH AND WELSH

LEARNERS WHO DON'T HAVE A GCSE GRADE C IN EITHER MATHS OR ENGLISH

As part of their study programme learners will work towards a grade C or higher in Maths and English. For learners who have a GCSE grade lower than a D, this may be through an Essential Skills course equivalent to a GCSE qualification.

ENGLISH AND MATHS: LEARNERS WHO HAVE A GCSE GRADE C IN ONE SUBJECT BUT NOT THE OTHER

Typically, these learners will be enrolled on a qualification as part of their study programme to work towards a GCSE grade C or higher in the subject that they have yet to achieve a C grade in. This will either be a GCSE re-sit programme or an Essential Skills course. They will discuss this with a subject expert.

FOR THOSE WITH A GCSE GRADE C MATHS AND ENGLISH

Learners will continue to develop and apply these skills throughout the rest of their study programme.

GCSE WELSH

Learners can also re-sit GCSE Welsh providing they gained a D grade or higher. Support with Welsh-medium study for first or second language Welsh speakers is available.
